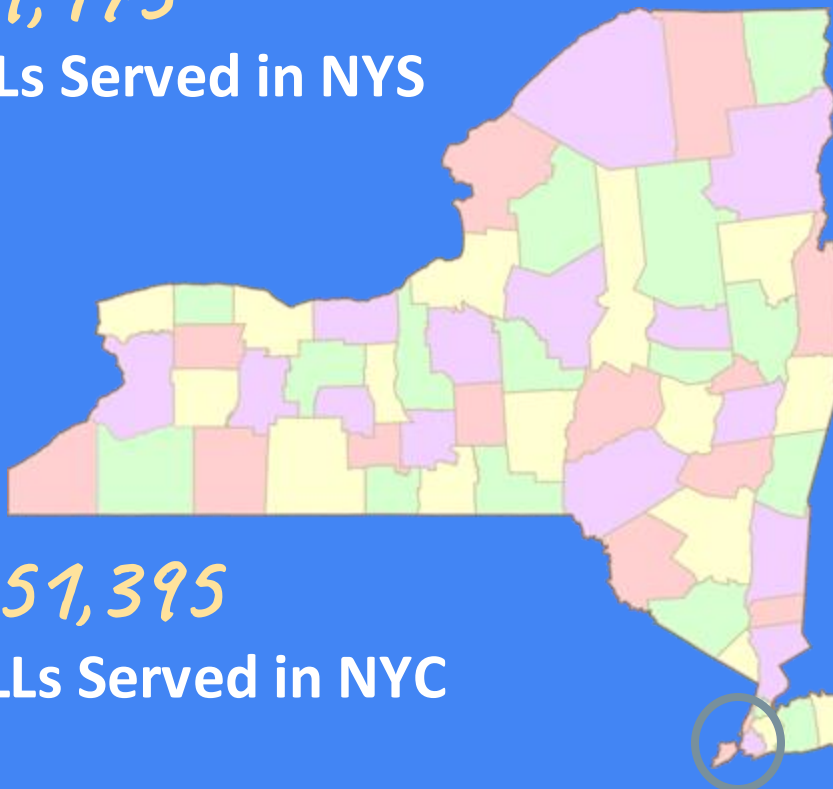

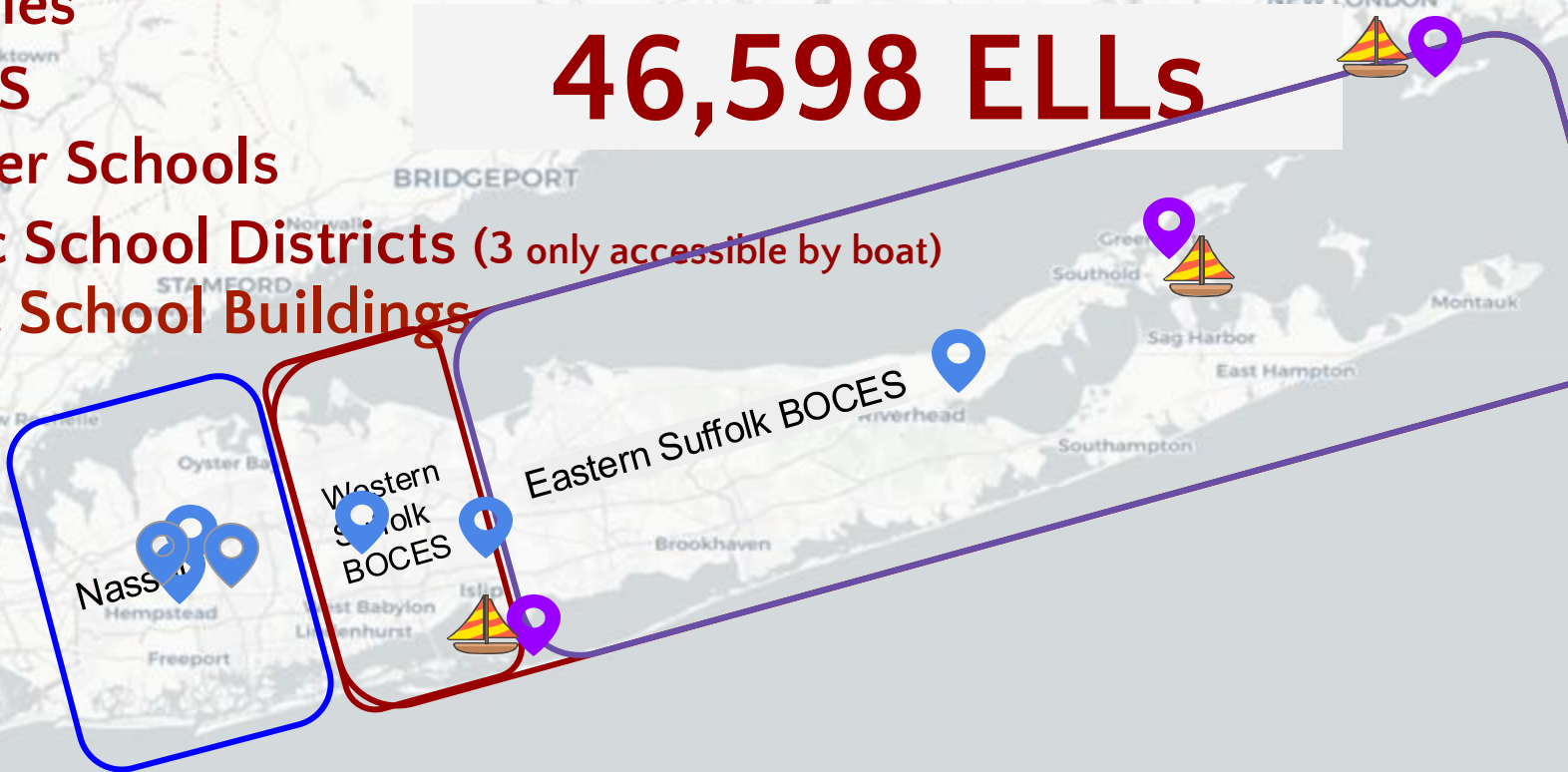

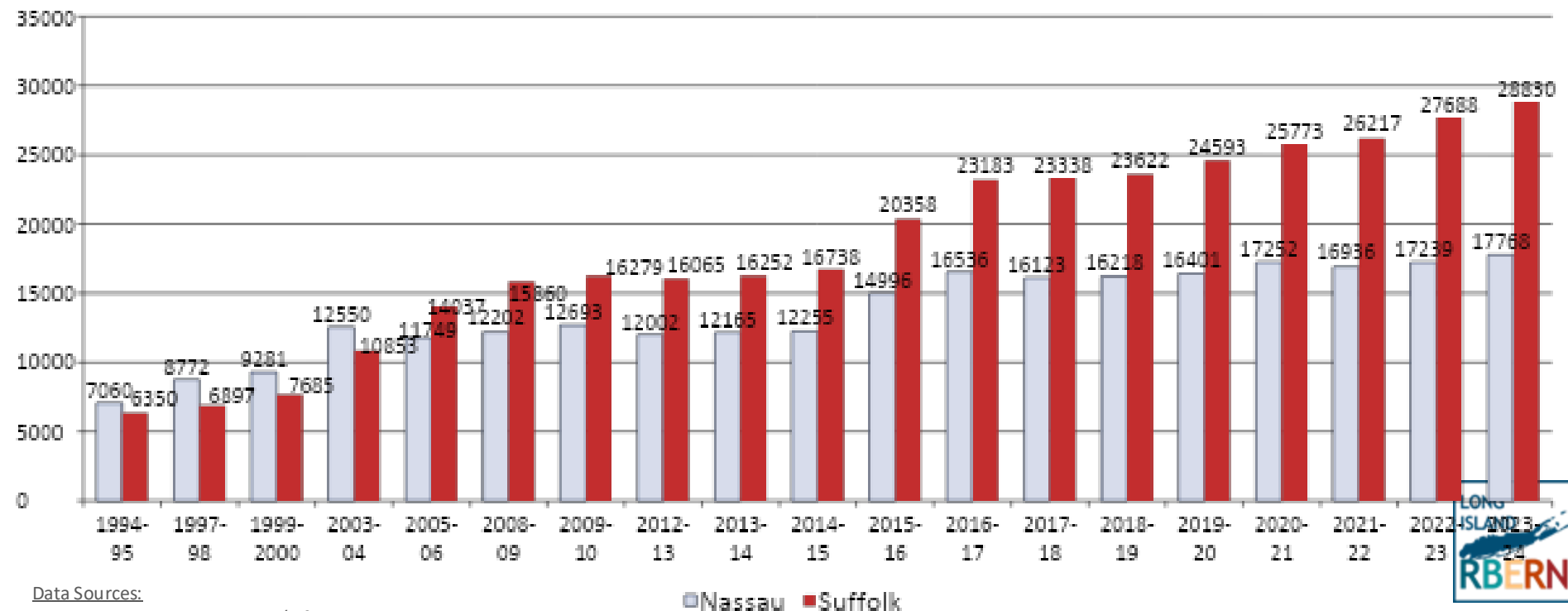

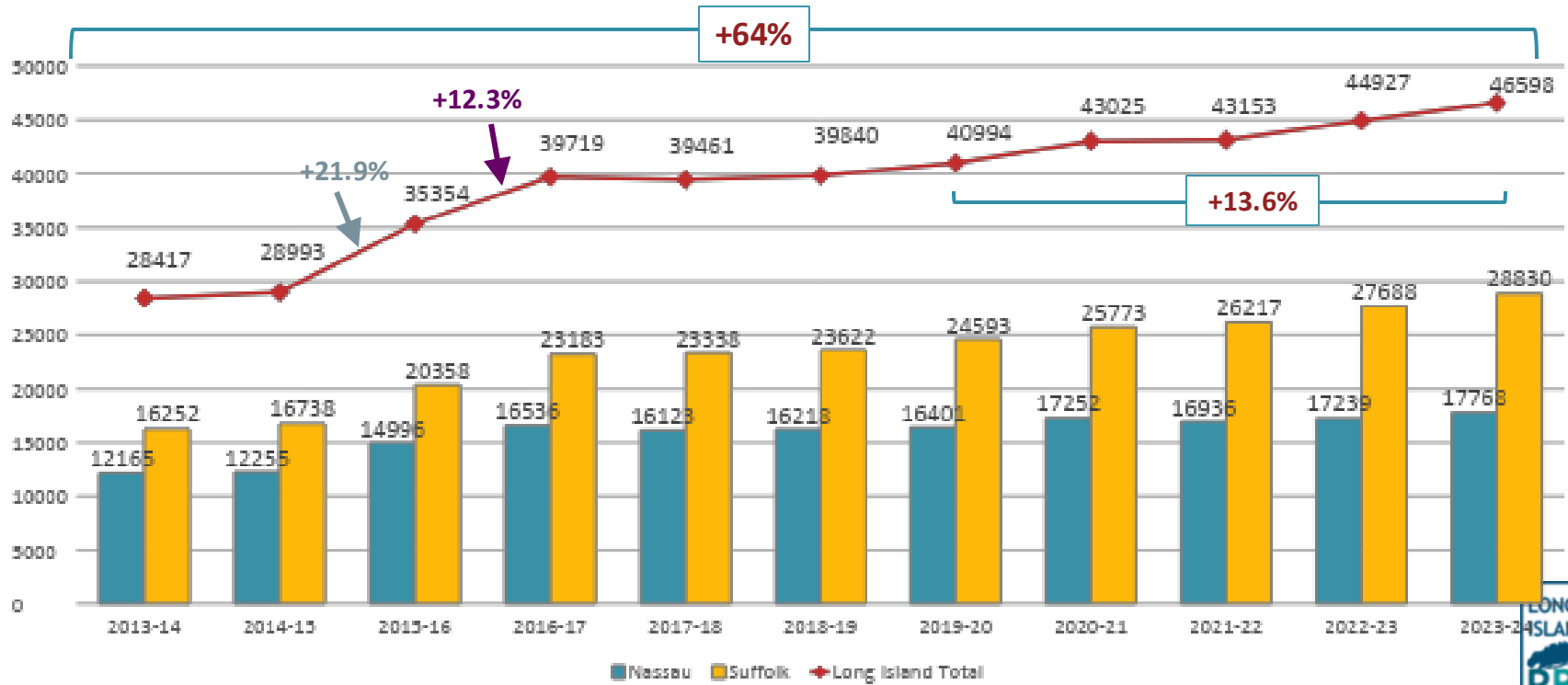

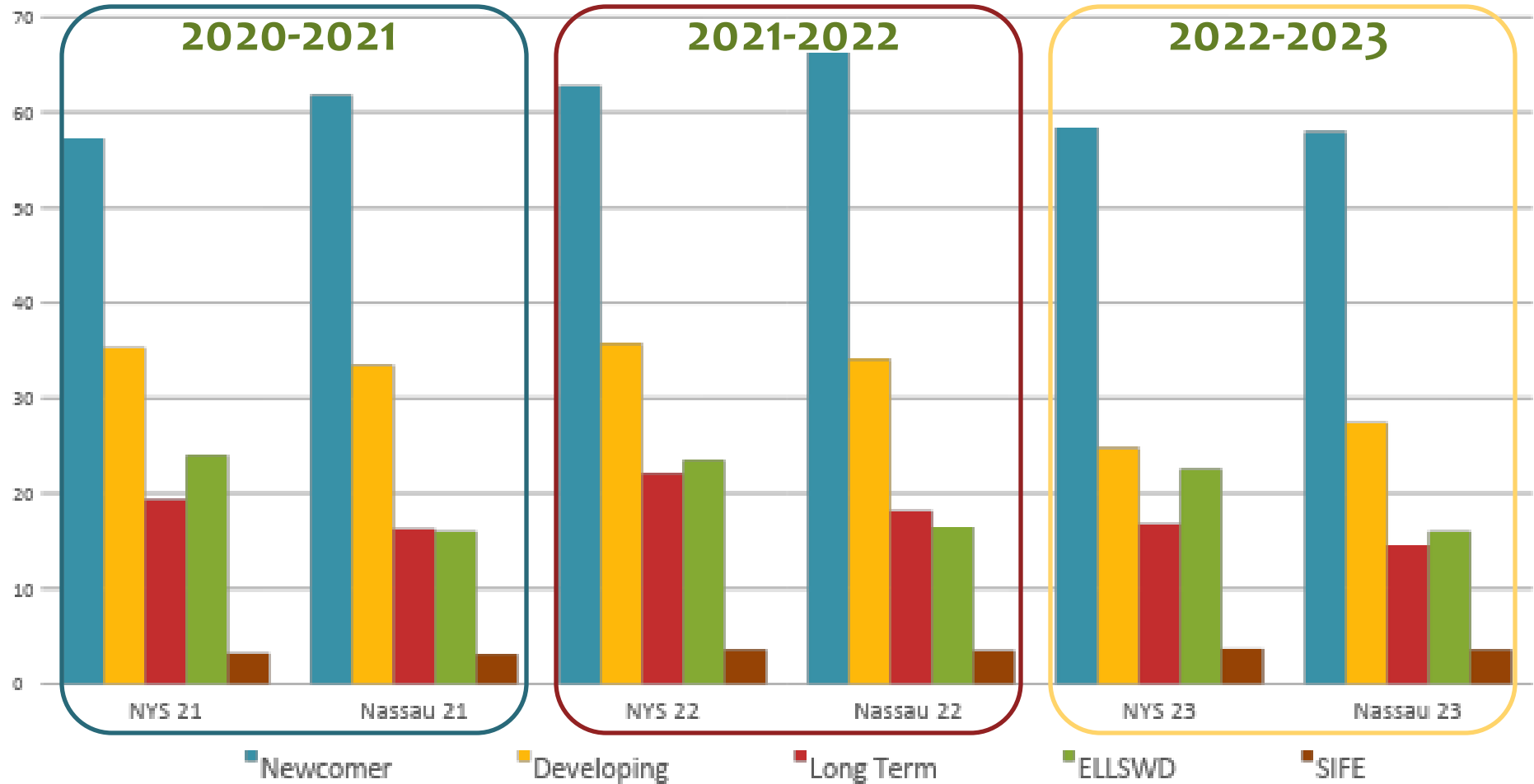

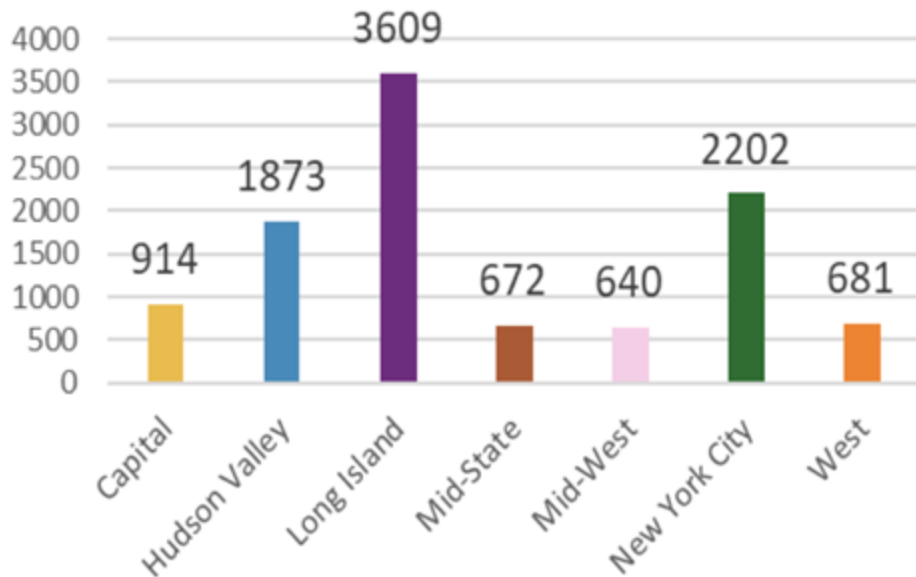
Fostering Collaboration in the Integrated ENL Classroom: A Deep Dive into the Co-teaching Topic Briefs

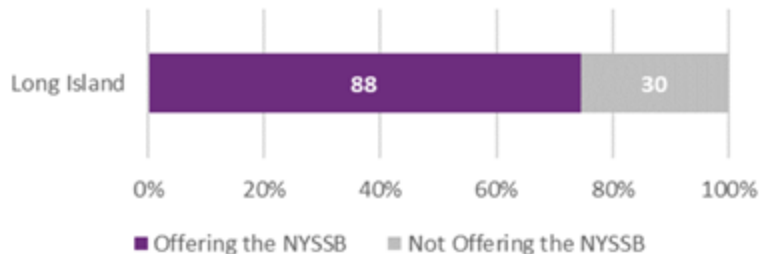


The New York State Seal of Biliteracy (NYSSB)
